

DAY & ZIMMERMAN SERVICES OUTBOUND POV CHECKLIST

1. Before you turn in your vehicle remember the **Three NOs**: No Caked Dirt, No Personal Property, and No Flammable materials.
No caked dirt means cleaning your car inside and out; engine and engine compartment, trunk, spare tire compartment, between and under seats, storage compartments and undercarriage.
 - a. No personal property means removing all loose items except those normally included for safe operations and repair such as a spare tire jack, first aid kit, warning triangle, fire extinguisher and tools not to exceed \$200.00 in value. Remove all factory or non-factory stereo and speakers in car or trunk not securely mounted (bolted down) or permanently fixed as part of the car.
 - b. No flammables means you must remove such items as car wax, warning flares and oils (ask for list of restricted and prohibited articles)
2. Make sure your vehicle is in a **safe and operable condition** (no leaks and mechanical defects)
3. Vehicles imported to U.S. must conform to DOT motor vehicle standards and bear a certification label attached in the area of the driver's door by the original manufacturer. Vehicle must also have DOT standard tires. Non-conforming POVs imported to the U. S. may require modifications through registered importers and independent commercial importers before registration.
4. Ensure your car contains no more than **one-fourth tank of fuel** (gasoline or diesel).

I understand that my POV will be refused for shipment if all of the above requirements are not met.
